

T4 Title and Style Tags

To Do

- 1) Use a T4 Title tag to make the titles dynamic.
- 2) The Stylesheet has been uploaded to the Media Library and referenced using a Media Tag. As an alternative, use a T4 Style tag to reference the Stylesheet and place the CSS in the Stylesheet tab.
- 3) To reference the Stylesheet build a T4 Media Tag to reference the CSS file in the Media Library.

Style:

3. Reference either the Stylesheet tab or a css file in the Media Library.
4. If using the Stylesheet tab, add the T4 style tag:
<t4 type="style" />
5. If the css file is in the Media Library, go to the T4 Tag tab and build a Media Tag.
