Create a navigation object for the top level navigation to output the branch at level 2.

Notes

1. Select **Navigation** from the **Assets** menu.
2. Click **Create New** beside the relevant group.
3. Click **Create New** beside **Link Menu**.
4. Create a navigation object to output the menu at level 2 as an unordered list.
5. Set the **Number of Levels to Recurse** to "0".
6. Click **Add** so save the new navigation object.
7. Select **Styles** from the **Assets** menu.
8. Go to the **T4 Tags** tab.
9. Build a navigation tag based on the new navigation object. Copy the tag.
10. Locate the original code for the top navigation in the header tab.
11. Replace with the T4 Tag.
12. **Update** your style and preview the result from the site structure.
